Bolton by Bowland and Gisburn Forest Neighbourhood Plan¹

Neighbourhood planning is an initiative of the government to give local communities real influence on how the area in which they live is planned.

At the Parish Council meeting on 3rd October 2016, **The Neighbourhood Plan for Bolton by Bowland and Gisburn Forest**² was accepted by the Parish Council to go forward to **Ribble Valley Borough Council (RVBC)**. A six-week statutory consultation period and scrutiny by an independent examiner will now take place.

The examiner will then either:

- Accept the plan
- · Suggest modifications to the plan
- Reject the plan

The consultation period will be from 23rd November until 4th January 2017.

This consultation will be your chance to make a formal representation. You can do this by responding directly to RVBC who will then forward your response to the examiner. Details will be available on the RVBC website.

If accepted by the examiner, **The Neighbourhood Plan** will then be subject to a referendum, where a simple majority of those voting in favour will be sufficient for RVBC to adopt the plan and for it to be part of the statutory development of the area.

Details of the referendum, expected to be in the first half of 2017, will be made available to all those declared eligible.

It is most important that you are aware of the details of **The Neighbourhood Plan**. This will enable you to make informed decisions as to whether you wish to **contribute your views in the consultation process** and also for you to make your decision in the referendum.
